Developer Griffon Property has now requested an extension to the time frame to submit plans for the site after the council denied consent last month. The plans, which included 17 blocks of flats, seven terraced blocks and three blocks of townhouses, are not yet ready for submission. Griffon said it will not, therefore, be able to make a submission, which was due by the end of May, until September. But the developers are still committed to the site. A spokesman for Griffon said: "We have a number of different options available to us, but all of them centre on trying to get onto the site. "We are committed to trying to resolve what we see as an obvious and potential issue with the site. "We have always been very clear about the fact that our proposal was a very good proposal. We are disappointed with the decision, but we are still committed to the site and we are still looking at ways of progressing it." Castle Bromwich MP Andrew Love, Labour's housing spokesman, said: "This is another step that shows the council's main priority is keeping developers happy. "The public should be very concerned about the lack of any sustainable housing in the borough. "We need developers to have confidence in us so we can use this area and can fulfil our housing and regeneration duty. "Councils should be dealing with local issues, not national ones, and many local people are struggling to find affordable homes in Birmingham."
